



Digital Diagnostics Aims


- Improve diagnostics processes across the region resulting in improved patient care
- Introduce digital diagnostic systems to promote collaborative working and instant sharing of information
- Digital Pathology, Haematology and Radiology
- Digitisation of referral and investigation processes
- Instant sharing of images, results and reports single patient record
- Reduce double testing
- Able remote working allowing flexible and more efficient working
- Ultimately impacting patient diagnosis timescales





Digital Systems Connectivity


- Trusts needed connectivity solution
- Investment was made in a region wide infrastructure solution
- Hub and spoke solution hosted by North Tees was developed for Digital Pathology
- Network enabled development for Digital Haematology and Digital Radiology
- Good foundations and learning for further regional digital projects.






National Elevation of Diagnostics

- Further national funding became available

Digital Diagnostic Programme Timeline 2021/2023





Digital Strategy Development

This Strategy is in line with the national strategy for diagnostics and aims to provide a direction of travel to secure modern diagnostic services for the people of North East and North Cumbria (NENC). The strategy focuses on the deliverables in the table below taken from the Diagnostics Recovery Strategy (Richards 2020) and how NENC will achieve these.



The Diagnostic Strategy is a subset of the ICS Long Term Plan for NENC. Oversight is provided by the Diagnostics Programme Board.
