Message from Alan Foster



From Monday 19 July further restrictions will be lifted across the country and as much as we all want life to get back to normal, some of us – including our frontline teams – may be feeling cautious about what lies ahead. Supporting our teams across health and care will be crucial in the weeks ahead as they continue to provide the very best care for our communities in challenging circumstances.

Just as we think we might be betting back to some normality, this virus seems to find another way to challenge us. The number of Covid-19 cases are continuing to rise across our region and in some areas they are the highest they have ever been. Thankfully hospital admissions are not as high as in previous waves but they are growing, so we must remain vigilant.

Whilst restrictions are being lifted in many other areas of our lives we are asking the public to keep doing their bit - to wear a mask, wash their hands and socially distance when visiting any healthcare settings to help keep our staff and patients safe. Healthcare settings provide a different challenge than public areas and it's clear that our current robust infection prevention control measures will continue to be vital in protecting people into the future. COVID-19 and the vaccine

The vaccine continues to be our best protection against this virus. As ever, there are huge efforts across the region to ensure as many people are getting vaccinated as quickly as possible. We are continuing to stress the importance of people booking and attending for their second jab to ensure they have the strongest possible protection against the virus.

Thank you again to everyone who has been involved in our vaccination programme for your incredible hard work and dedication to protecting our communities. We are now focusing on plans for the Covid booster and the flu vaccination season.

This weekend locations across the region will open up and offer people the chance to 'grab a jab' as we seek to maximise protection from Covid before restrictions are lifted on Monday.

Health and care bill

The Health and Care Bill has now been formally introduced to the House of Commons and went through its first reading last week. There was a further reading this week and we are waiting for guidance following the outcome of this but will update you as soon as we can.

This is big step in setting out the operating model for integrated care systems (ICSs) from April 2022 and we are already thinking about how we can continue to build on the already excellent work underway to further integrate health and care across the region.

As you are aware from my previous updates, myself and Sir Liam Donaldson have been meeting colleagues in each ICP area to hold discussions and understand how place-based working works well in the different areas of our region. Thank you to colleagues who took the time to meet us in Tees Valley earlier this week. We look forward to discussing this further with colleagues so we can continue to work together to deliver our ambition to improve the health of all our communities.

Finally, thanks again to everyone for all they are doing to care for and protect our communities. And to our communities for all they are doing to support us.
