<u>Freedom of Information Act 2000 - Request for Information - NHS North East & North Cumbria Integrated Care Board.</u>

Thank you for your request received by North of England Commissioning Support (NECS) on 29 July 2022 for information held by NHS North East and North Cumbria Integrated Care Board (ICB) under the provisions of the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

For information Clinical Commissioning Groups ceased to exist on 30 June 2022. Services that were previously delivered by the CCG are now being delivered by the successor organisation NHS North East and North Cumbria (ICB). This covers the areas of County Durham, Newcastle Gateshead, North Cumbria, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside, Sunderland and Tees Valley.

Please find the information you requested on behalf of the ICB as follows.

- 4) Can you provide a yearly breakdown of how many people have been treated with BDD per year over the past 20 years (or as far back as the records allow you to search) in each area (where their GP was registered) If you don't have this information, then please just send any data you have for the whole area you cover.

- 5) How many people have been offered therapy after a diagnosis of body dysmorphic disorder per year from 2000 2022 (or as far back as the records allow you to search)
